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## The MCNPUM Capability for MCNP6's Unstructured Mesh Feature

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## 1 Introduction

This report documents a new file type that has recently been added to MCNP6 [1] for use with the unstructured mesh (UM) feature. This capability allows the user to request that the code convert an Abaqus [2] inp file to a new format called the mcnpum format; MCNP6 can also read this new UM file format. Changes to the EMBED card are required to accommodate this capability. This report documents the verification of this capability.

## 2 Discussion

The Abaqus input file contains some basic information about the unstructured mesh, but does not contain everything that MCNP6 needs. Once MCNP6 reads this file, it uses the Abaqus data to generate other information that it needs in its tracking routines such as nearest neighbor lists. That is, it converts the Abaqus information to its internal data structures. Even with the parallel input processing, Reference [3], significant computer time can be required to regenerate these internal data structures for every MCNP calculation that uses the Abaqus inp unstructured mesh file. This is extremely burdensome when large UM files are needed in repeated calculations.

The mcnpum file type was created to contain all of the unstructured mesh data structures that MCNP needs, thus eliminating the need to "input process" the Abaqus input file every time the code is run, including continue runs. MCNP can generate this file (primarily after processing the Abaqus input file) by simply including the mcnpumfile option on the embed card. MCNP can use the mcnpum file when the mcnpum keyword is supplied to the MESHGEO parameter on the EMBED card. See the input cards section in Reference [3].

Details on the structure of the mcnpum file type are beyond the scope of the document. The truly interested reader should look at the MCNP source code. It is possible that the structure of this file may change over time.

## 3 Verification

Verification of this capability is in several parts and includes initial runs, continue runs, creating the mcnpum file, volume sources, and mixing use with the traditional Abaqus inp file in a multi-mesh run. More details are provided in the verification sections that follow.

#### 3.1 Verification With 1001 Problem Geometry

Regression problem 1001 from MCNP6's REGRESSION test suite contains 6 parts (pseudo-cells) with each part constructed from one of the six allowable finite element types. See Reference [3] for more on these element types. It is crucial that these six element types are tested since internal to MCNP6 their information is contained in different data structures and consequently represent different (non-trivial) sections of both the mcnpum and eeout files.

Problem 1001 is a fixed source ray-tracing problem. The source particles are started from a spherical surface that surrounds all three universes and are directed inward. The VOID card is used to void out all materials in the problem. Consequently, the pedigree of the cross sections is not important. When the WGT parameter on the SDEF card is set to a value corresponding to the surface area of the sphere, this problem becomes one of stochastically estimating the volumes of each cell or UM element as discussed in Reference [4]'s section on Stochastic Volume and Area Calculations.

Problem 1001 is a neutron only problem with two edits. The flux edit produces meaningful flux edits given the small number of histories (10,000) run while the energy deposition edit produces all zeros since the materials have been voided in each cell and no energy deposition takes place.

#### 3.1.1 Three Part Verification

Verification with the 1001 problem geometry is done in three parts, demonstrating three important scenarios required by MCNP6. First, problem 1043 generates a mcnpum version of the problem 1001 Abaqus inp file, demonstrating the ability to correctly process the mcnpumfile input parameter and generate a mcnpum file. Next, problem 1044 uses the mcnpum file generated with problem 1043 and performs an initial calculation with it while running a total of 10,000 histories. This demonstrates the code's ability to read the new file type correctly and successfully perform the calculation. Lastly, problem 1045 is a continue run of problem 1044 for a total of 20,000 histories and demonstrates the code's ability to successfully use the new file type under this set of circumstances. The MCNP6 inputs for these three REGRESSION suite test problems are given in the sections that follow.

Since there are a total of 331 elements in this UM geometry, it is tedious to provide in this document results for each element. In the process of this verification, two sets of comparisons were made between the eeout and fmesh output files produced by the code for each of the runs. Running a Linux diff utility between appropriate files for the initial (problems 1001 and 1044) and continue (problems 1002 and 1045) runs showed that the results were identical in all cases.

### 3.2 Verification With Volume Sources

Verification of this capability with UM volume sources is essential since 1) the code must use the mesh information to construct the volume source data structures and 2) the code must correctly write/read these data structures to/from the mcnpum file. Volume source testing is done with three problems.

The first problem is 1046 (mcnpum equivalent of 1012) and tests a single volume source. This fixed-source, neutron-only problem has allof the first order element types. The second problem is 1047 (mcnpum equivalent of 1020) and tests two volumes sources (source cells) where the UM pseudo-cells are sampled from a distribution on the SDEF card before the final position is selected within the chosen pseudo-cell. This is a fixed-source, neutron-only problem. The third problem is 1053 and is a continue run of 1047 for an additional 10,000 histories. Until 1053 was added to the test suite, none of the other REGRESSION problems tested the volume source in a continue run.

Since there are many elements in these UM geometries, it is tedious to provide results for each element. For this set of verification problems, two sets of comparisons were made between the eeout and mctal output files produced by the code for each of the runs. Running a Linux diff utility between appropriate files for the problems using the Abaqus inp files (problems 1012 and 1020) and problems using the mcnpum files (problems 1046 and 1047) runs showed that the results were identical in all cases. A continue run of 1020 was made and appropriate files where compared to those generated by 1053; again, results were identical for both the eeout and mctal files.

## 3.3 Verification Of Mixed File Types

One verification problem, 1048, was added to the REGRESSION test suite to demonstrate that the code can read both the Abaqus inp file and the MCNP6 mcnpum file in the same calculation and produce the correct results. This is significant in that it shows that the internal data structures can be created and populated by both mechanisms without interference. Problem 1048 is a modification of REGRESSION problem 1037; its input appears below. These problems are ray-tracing problems like those describe in Section 3.1.

As with the other problems discussed in this document, comparisons were made between the eeout and metal files created from these two calculations. As before, running a Linux diff utility between appropriate files for the problems showed that the results were identical in all cases.

## 4 Summary

This document provides verification that the UM flux mcnpum capability is functioning as expected. The verification procedure for the mcnpum file type capability was to create mcnpm equivalent problems from other UM test problems, run these calculations as before, and compare eeout, fmesh, and/or mctal output files using a Linux diff utility. In all such comparisons, there was identical agreement. This work demonstrates that the mcnpum file capability is working correctly for initial runs, continue runs, creating mcnpum files, volume sources, and mixed use with the traditional Abaqus inp file in a multi-mesh run.

Provided here within are the MCNP6 input listings used in this verification. The problems described is this documents are regression problems 1043-1048 and 1053 in the MCNP6 REGRESSION test suite.
